Thank you for your immediate reply today.

Yes here is the Privacy Consent Form that Marco Rubio's office sent me and my request to investigate the corruption.

Below in blue is the email Rubio sent me:

Dear Mr. Myers,

I regret to learn of the problem you are experiencing with the U.S. Department of Justice. It is disappointing that your concerns have not received the appropriate attention. David on my staff has thoroughly reviewed your correspondence and contacted the U.S. Department of Justice to inquire about this matter. My office will contact you when we receive additional information regarding your case.

Please bear in mind that some federal agencies require four to six weeks to properly investigate a congressional inquiry. Although I cannot guarantee a particular outcome, I will do my best to ensure you receive a fair and timely response.
