This grievance protests the five-day suspension with intent to discharge issued to Joseph Myers by letter dated April 5, 2001.

At the Step III hearing, the Union claimed violations of Articles IV-A-1 and 2 and IX-A-1 of the Basic Agreement. In support of this position, the Union claimed that the grievant did not use Company time and materials to write, copy and distribute a personal letter. To the contrary, the Union claimed this was a work related letter as it pertained to a safety issue. The Union also claimed the grievant was willing to haul according to CDL limits, Finally, the Union presented at the Step Me earing a copy a a picture labeled method of hauling coils on well trailer and for proper chaining method of triple E oils" to be added to the Grievance Record aa
A review of the facts including the Union's Step III presentation indicates that the grievant's rights have not been violated as alleged. The grievant violated Company rules and policy and demonstrated insubordinate behavior. Management properly exercised its rights pursuant to Article IV of the Basic Agreement. The grievant was properly discharged with just cause and after due consideration.

This grievance is denied.
