ORDER

The trial court record has been filed in this office in the above-captioned matter.

It is your responsibility to review the record inventory list and make sure that the certified record forwarded to this court contains those documents necessary to the issues raised on appeal; failure to do so may result in waiver. Pa.R.A.P. 1926,1931 (d); Bennyhoff v. Pappert, 790 A.2d 313 (Pa.Super.2001); Commonwealth v. Wint, 730 A.2d 965 (Pa.Super.1999).

Pursuant to Pa.R.A.P. 2185(a) briefs for the appellant must be filed on or before March 25, 2020.

Upon failure to timely file briefs for the appellant, the court will, on its own motion and without further notice, dismiss the appeal. If the briefs are filed late but before the appeal is dismissed counsel shall not be permitted to argue but shall be available to answer any questions the court may ask.

Pursuant to Pa.R.A.P. 2111(B), copies of the trial court opinion must be appended to the appellant's brief. Briefs will not be accepted for filing unless you comply with this request.

Seven (7) copies of briefs, together with two (2) copies of the reproduced record, if applicable, must be filed and opposing parties must be served.

If this is a cross appeal, your attention is directed to Pa.R.A.P. 2136 to determine which party is considered the appellant for the purpose of establishing the briefing schedule.

OFFICE OF THE PROTHONOTARY

You are reminded that your brief must comply with Pa.R.A.P. 124, which directs that all briefs be double-spaced and in font no smaller than 14 point. You must also comply with Pa.R.A.P. 2135, which imposes word limitations and certification requirements. The Superior Court's preferred font is Verdana.

Pa.R.A.P. 124 requires that all filers leave the original filing unbound but securely clipped. Remaining copies are to be securely bound. Those filing on *paper, not PACFiling, must deliver or **mail briefs and reproduced records to their respective district filing offices as follows:

- 6 bound and 1 unbound copy of any brief (Non-PCRA brief) and CD or flash drive
- 3 bound and 1 unbound copy of any PCRA brief and CD or flash drive
- 1 bound and 1 unbound copy of any reproduced record and CD or flash drive

Those who PACFile their brief and reproduced record must deliver the copies noted above, with the exception that all copies are to be bound, within 7 calendar days, and should not provide a CD or flash drive.

*Paper briefs and reproduced records must be accompanied by an electronic copy on CD or flash drive, formatted in PDF. Microsoft Word files are not acceptable. Requirements for CD's and Flash Drives:

- CD's and flash drives should be accompanied by an averment that the material included is an accurate and complete representation of the paper version of the filing.
- Word files must be converted to .PDF format, standard quality. If a document must be scanned, the scan setting should be 300 dpi for black and white and 200 dpi for color.
- Separate documents must be provided as separate files. For example, a separate brief and reproduced record should be separate files on the CD or flash drive.
- Name documents clearly, such as Brief for Appellant. Use only letters, numbers, dashes and spaces in naming.
- Label discs and flash drives with the Superior Court docket number, the name of the party and the
 name of the filing. Write on the disc with a permanent marker or print directly on the disc. Do <u>not</u>
 use mailing labels or other adhesive labels on discs. Flash drives may be identified with adhesive
 tags.

**Please note that Pa.R.A.P. 2185(a)(1), (2), concerning service and filing of briefs will be strictly enforced. The rule specifically limits the circumstances under which the date of mailing will be deemed the date of filing: "Briefs shall be deemed filed on the date of mailing if first class, express, or priority United States Postal Service mail is utilized." Deliveries made by commercial carrier do not qualify for such treatment and will be docketed with the date of receipt in the filing office.
